

The first lesson is written in the twelfth chapter of the first Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians, beginning at the first verse.

NOW concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I would not have you ignorant. Ye know that ye were Gentiles, carried away unto these dumb idols, even as ye were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed: and that no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. And there are differences of administrations, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God which worketh all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. The second lesson is written in the nineteenth chapter of the Gospel according to St Luke, beginning at the fortyfirst verse.

THE COMMUNION

¶ In accordance with the Anglican tradition, Holy Communion is administered in both kinds i.e. the consecrated Bread and Wine. During the current pandemic, this can only be offered by intinction i.e. the consecrated wafer dipped in the consecrated wine, as the sharing of the Common Cup (Chalice) by sipping the consecrated wine is not permitted.

An Aramaic source described the parable thus: 'They came to Jerusalem, and He went to the temple, and began to throw out those who sold and those who bought in the temple.¹ And He over-turned the tables of the money-changers and the chairs of those who sold the doves. He did not allow a man to carry a vessel through the temple. He was teaching, and He said: "Is it not written 'My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the nations' and you have made it 'a robbers' cave'.² And the chief priests and the scribes heard, and sought how they might destroy him'. The date of this event was shortly before the feast of Passover and Unleavened Bread. It was also an important event in the closing stages of Jesus' ministry. Preventing the carrying of vessels through the house of God was central to this event. In addition the removal of money-changers and merchants ensured the sanctity of the house of God. This temple was to be a house of prayer, which included normal sacrifices. Jesus' actions were a serious threat to the authority and riches of the chief priests and scribes, leading ultimately to the final actions against Him.³
